Mrs. **Elizabeth Lewis** at 101 years old is our Post's oldest living veteran. During WW II, **Elizabeth** served as a surgical nurse in both the European and Pacific theater of operations. She treated over 2,000 wounded soldiers from 1943 to 1945.

She was recently honored as a Living Legend by the Military Women's Memorial in Arlington, Virginia.

The Military Women's Memorial Living Legend Program recognizes military women whose stories of service provide inspiration and example for all to appreciate. These stories are deemed to be of interest or benefit to increase public awareness of women's contribution to America's national defense and deserve special recognition. Proclamations can be issued for any one of the following reasons:

1. Women Veterans reaching their 100th birthday.
2. Women whose story of service are particularly inspiring.
3. Retirements from a career of notable service.

**Elizabeth** was selected for 1 and 2.

The Mission of the Military Women's Memorial is to honor women, past and present, who serve our nation by sharing their stories of service. The Memorial educates the public and empowers other young women. The Living Legend Program serves to ensure these stories and these women are not forgotten.

**Elizabeth** is one of 54 women nationwide who have been designated a Living legend.

4. Legion dues are \$35.00 and your new 2022 membership card will be mailed to you. Please provide your address, email and phone number. It's important to be able to contact you. Your information is stored in a protected database, accessible to only the post officers with the need to know. **Dept. of Veterans Affairs, State Veterans Home.** State Veterans Homes are facilities that provide nursing home, domiciliary or adult day care. They are owned, operated and managed by state governments. They date back to the post-Civil War era when many states created them to provide shelter to homeless and disabled Veterans.

To participate in the State Veterans Home program, VA must formally recognize and certify a facility as a State Veterans Home. VA then surveys all facilities each year to make sure they continue to meet VA standards. VA does not manage State Veterans Homes.

**Eligibility Requirements:** The applicant must be a former active duty member of the U.S. armed forces whose last term of service concluded with an honorable discharge. The applicant must also have been a resident of the Commonwealth of Virginia at the time of entry into the U.S. armed forces or immediately before application. The applicant must meet the State Licensure criteria for nursing home or meet the criteria for Nursing or Residential/Assisted Living Care.

**Application Process:** Contact the Virginia Veterans Care Center (VVCC) Admissions director, 1-800-220-VETS, or the website at [www.dvs.virginia.gov](http://www.dvs.virginia.gov)

Virginia Veterans Care is governed by the Virginia Department of Veterans Services.

**Services Provided:** Skilled nursing care and bed Assisted Living/Domiciliary care; physical, occupational and speech therapy, Alzheimer's/Dementia Special Care unit, and Hospice program.

*The National Association of State Veterans Homes' primary mission is to promote and enhance the quality of care and life of Veterans and families in the State Veterans homes through education, networking, and advocacy.*

## **ATTENTION for those who have served during OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM**

March 20, 2022, marks the 19<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the beginning of Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF). This anniversary provides us with an opportunity to reflect on the sacrifices of those who served in a conflict that lasted nearly nine years and claimed the lives of nearly 4,500 service members and left over 31,000 wounded. If you served in OIF, and have a disability or illness as a result, you may be eligible for VA benefits and services.

Those who served in OIF, or the Southwest Asia Theater of Operations and other locations, may now be entitled to compensation for medical conditions presumed to be related to exposure to fine particulate matter.

Veterans and survivors who believe they may be eligible for compensation for asthma, rhinitis or sinusitis that emerged within a 10-year period after separation from military service are encouraged to file a claim for benefits. Those who served in the following locations are presumed to have been exposed to particulate matter and may be entitled to the new presumption:

- Southwest Asia Theater of Operations beginning August 2, 1990, to the present.
  - Afghanistan, Uzbekistan, Syria or Djibouti beginning September 19, 2001, to the present.
- The Southwest Asia Theater of Operations refers to these locations and the air space above them:

- Iraq.
- Kuwait.
- Saudi Arabia.
- The neutral zone between Iraq and Saudi Arabia.
- Bahrain.
- Qatar.
- The United Arab Emirates.
- Oman.
- The Gulf of Aden.
- The Gulf of Oman.
- The Persian Gulf.
- The Arabian Sea.
- The Red Sea.

### **File a disability claim**

If you have an illness or condition related to particulate matter, exposure or any other military environmental exposure, we encourage you to file a claim.

If you were previously denied service connection for any of the new conditions but had symptoms manifest within 10 years of military service, you will need to file another claim. Be sure to use [VA Form 20-0995, “Decision Review Request: Supplemental Claim”](#) when filing. The claim form should include the name of the diagnosed medical condition. If you have additional questions about the claim process, visit [VA.gov](#) or call 1- 800-827-1000.

**IMPORTANT INFO from the VFW: VA Claim Sharks:** Have you been charged unnecessary fees to file a VA disability claim? If so, we want to hear from you. The VFW reported in the June/July 2021 issue of the VFW magazine that predatory companies, referred to as “claim sharks,” coach veterans in filing VA disability claims with promises of increased ratings while charging them fees and taking a portion of their compensation. Veterans service organizations like the VFW (American Legion) have accredited service officers who provide claims assistance to veterans **free of charge, as is the law**. If you or someone you know has been charged unnecessary fees for VA claims assistance, please contact the VFW at [vfwac@vfw.org](mailto:vfwac@vfw.org).

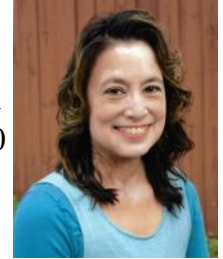
