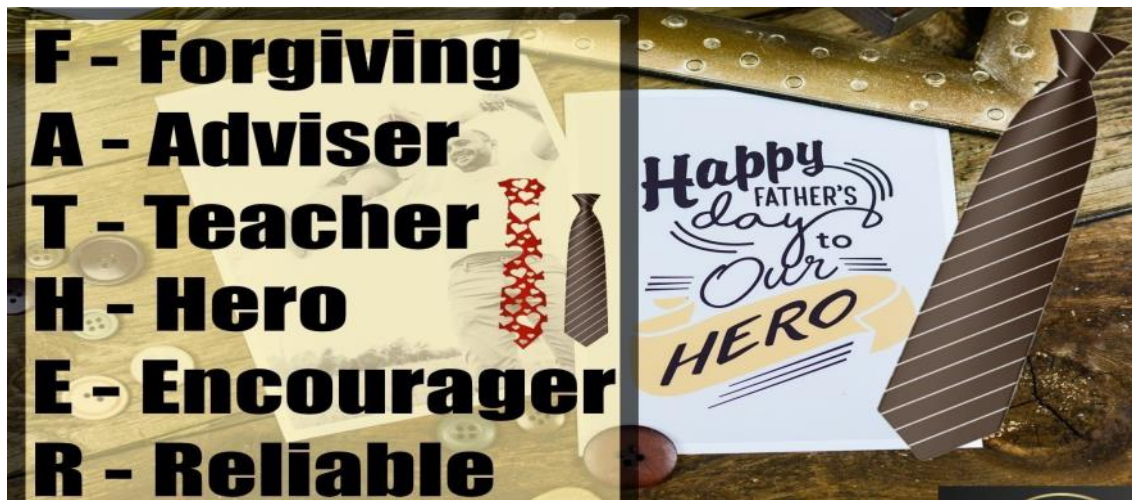
Commander's Column

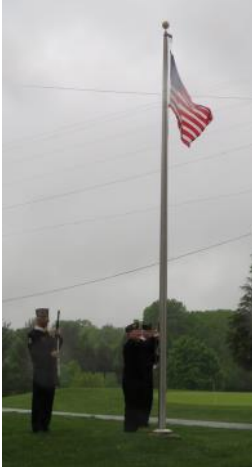
Veterans Fishing Adventure—Christening of two new boats—29 APR 2023

Korean War: The Korean war began on June 25, 1950, when some 75,000 soldiers from the North Korean People's Army came across the 38th parallel, the boundary between the Soviet-backed Democratic People's Republic of Korea to the north and the pro-Western Republic of Korea to the south. This invasion was the first military action of the Cold War. By July, American troops had entered the war on South Korea's behalf. It was a war against the forces of international communism. After some early back-and-forth across the 38th parallel, the fighting stalled and casualties mounted. American officials worked to fashion some sort of armistice with the North Koreans. The alternative, they feared, would be a wider war with Russia and China—or even, as some warned, World War III. Finally, in July 1953, the Korean War came to an end. In all, some 5 million soldiers and civilians lost their lives in what many in the U.S. refer to as **“the Forgotten War”** for the lack of attention it received compared to more well-known conflicts like World War I and II. The Korean peninsula is still divided today.

Have you wondered about the history of Flag Day?

When the American Revolution broke out in 1775, the colonists weren't fighting united under a single flag. Instead, most regiments participating in the War for Independence fought under their own flags. In June of 1775, the Second Continental Congress met in Philadelphia to create the Continental Army, a unified colonial fighting force. This led to the creation of the first "American" flag, the Continental Colors.

For some, this flag, which was comprised of 13 red and white alternating stripes and a Union Jack in the corner, was too much like that of the British flag. **George Washington** soon realized that flying a flag that was even remotely close to the British flag was not a great confidence-builder for the revolutionary effort, so he turned his efforts towards creating a new symbol of freedom.

On June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress took a break from writing the Articles of Confederation and passed a resolution stating that "the flag of the United States be 13 stripes, alternate red and white," and that "the union be 13 stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation.

In 1916, **President Wilson** marked the anniversary of that decree by officially establishing June 14 as Flag Day. As you celebrate the anniversary of the Stars and Stripes, here are some fast facts about "Old Glory."

- **Bernard Cigrand**, a Wisconsin teacher, originated the idea for an annual flag day in 1885, to be celebrated across the country every June 14. He led his school in the first formal observance of the holiday. **Cigrand**, who later changed careers and practiced dentistry in Illinois, continued to promote his concept and advocate respect for the flag throughout his life.

- It is widely believed that **Betsy Ross**, who assisted the Revolutionary War effort by repairing uniforms and sewing tents, made and helped design the first American flag. However, there is no historical evidence that she contributed to Old Glory's creation. It was not until her grandson **William Canby** held an 1870 press conference to recount the story that the American public learned of her possible role.

And that in a nutshell is the history of Flag Day.

HAPPY 248th BIRTHDAY, ARMY! The US Army was founded on 14 June 1775, when the Continental Congress authorized enlistment of riflemen to serve the United Colonies for one year. The 14 June date is when Congress adopted "the American continental army" after reaching a consensus position in The Committee of the Whole. This procedure and the desire for secrecy account for the sparseness of the official entries for the day. Congress undertook to raise 10 companies of riflemen, approved an enlistment for them, and appointed a committee to draft rules and regulations for the government of the army. There was a time when there were never more than 48,000 Continental soldiers. Today, the Army boasts over one million soldiers on duty, with an additional 800,000 Reserve and National Guard members.

During World War II (1939-1945), the Battle of Normandy, which lasted from June 1944 to August 1944, resulted in the Allied liberation of Western Europe from Nazi Germany's control. Codenamed Operation Overlord, the battle began on June 6, 1944, also known as **D-Day**, when some 156,000 American, British and Canadian forces landed on five beaches along a 50-mile stretch of the heavily fortified coast of France's Normandy region. The invasion was one of the largest amphibious military assaults in history and required extensive planning. Prior to D-Day, the Allies conducted a large-scale deception campaign designed to mislead the Germans about the intended invasion target. By late August 1944, all of northern France had been liberated, and by the following spring the Allies had defeated the Germans. The Normandy landings have been called the beginning of the end of war in Europe. By dawn on June 6, 1944, thousands of paratroopers and glider troops were already on the ground behind enemy lines, securing bridges and exit roads. The amphibious invasion began at 0630 hours. British and Canadian troops overcame light opposition to capture beaches codenamed Gold, Juno, and Sword, as did American troops on Utah Beach. US forces faced heavy resistance at Omaha Beach where there were over 2,000 American casualties. By day's end, approximately 156,000 Allied troops had successfully stormed Normandy's beaches. The estimate is that more than 4,000 Allied troops were killed. On June 11th the beaches were fully secured and over 326,000 troops, 50,000 plus vehicles and some 100,000 tons of equipment had landed at Normandy. In the following weeks the Allies fought their way across the Normandy countryside in the face of determined German resistance. The Normandy invasion began to turn the tide against the Nazis. On May 8, 1945, the Allies accepted the unconditional surrender of Nazi Germany.

To renew on-line you will need to have or create an account on MyLegion.org. Online renewals can also print out a new membership card on-line. This will show that you are paid up and I will also send out a new 2023 card once I am notified by National of your renewal.

There are several ways to renew your American Legion membership:

1. Online at www.mylegion.org. You can use a credit card online and set-up automatic yearly renewal with your credit card. You can also update your profile information: address and phone number. You need your permanent membership ID number to start an account at mylegion.org. If you have a hand written card, you probably have a temporary number. Email me for your permanent number.
2. By mail. If you've received your renewal request from National Headquarters, mail it to Post 10 at 9950 Cockrell Road, Manassas, VA 20110 attn: Post 10 Membership. If you haven't received a form from National Headquarters, send a check, and a note with your name, ID number, address, email and phone number.
3. In person. Stop by Post 10 and ask the bartender for a membership envelope, fill out the envelope, include your membership number and dues.
4. Legion dues are \$35.00 and your new 2023 membership card will be mailed to you. Please provide your address, email and phone number. It's important to be able to contact you. Your information is stored in a protected database, accessible to only the post officers with the need to know. If you have an email account, and can receive the newsletter electronically, it will save the Post money.

Has your child's or grandchild's health been affected by your military service? If you believe your child or grandchild has a health issue that may be linked to your exposure while serving in our Nation's armed forces, have them file a claim with the assistance of an accredited Veterans Service Officer. Expect these claims to be denied. The important thing is to get these kids registered in the VA system. The children's claims are not processed with the veterans claims.

It is very important that you know that you must sign and complete a "Appointment of Veterans Service Organization as Claimant's Representative (also called "power of attorney"). This authorizes The American Legion to assist Veterans and beneficiaries. Additionally, please send your full and complete contact information. You cannot have more than one POA!

I am available to assist Veterans and their families in completing and filing benefit claims. Contact **Ginger Harvey** at: ginger.c.harvey@gmail.com for VA claims assistance.
