You need your permanent membership ID number to start an account at mylegion.org. If you have a hand written card, you probably have a temporary number. Email me for your permanent number. Online renewals can also print out a new membership card on-line. This will show that you are paid up and I will also send out a new 2024 card once I am notified by National of your renewal.
- 2. By mail. If you've received your renewal request from National Headquarters, mail it to Post 10 at 9950 Cockrell Road, Manassas, VA 20110 attn: Post 10 Membership. If you haven't received a form from National Headquarters, send a check, and a note with your name, ID number, address, email and phone number.
- 3. In person. Stop by Post 10 and ask the bartender for a membership envelope, fill out the envelope, include your membership number and dues.

The mission of VA's Nutrition and Food Services is to care for America's Veterans with complete nutrition care based on science. With the help of a VA Dietitian, Veterans can learn how to choose nutritious foods to meet their long-term health goals. For recipes, videos, podcasts and other resources, visit the VA Nutrition and Food Services National Nutrition Month resource page.

Eat Wisely: The National Center for Health Promotion and Disease Prevention is VA's primary source for healthy living education. In March, the focus is on the Eat Wisely message. Here are some ideas:

- Follow a healthy eating pattern that is right for you
- Choose nutritious foods and drinks that you enjoy, reflect your culture and fit your budget
- Choose more vegetables and fruits, and stay within appropriate calorie limits
- Limit foods and beverages that contain higher amounts of added sugars, saturated fat and sodium, and limit alcohol.

Veterans: Guard Against Identity Theft:

Identity theft can happen in a lot of ways: a stolen wallet, a missing phone, or a hacked online account. Then there are impersonators — scammers who pretend to be almost anyone. They'll tell you almost any story to get you to trust them, so they can steal your money or information. If you're a veteran, there's another risk: sharing information with someone who claims they'll help with paperwork and filing benefits claims. But instead of helping you for free as they're supposed to, dishonest advisers charge you — and may take and misuse your information, too. What are some ways to protect yourself from identity theft targeting veterans?

Don't pay to file — or get help with — VA benefits claims. It's free to apply for any type of veterans' benefits. Scammers may offer to help you for a fee or a percentage of the benefits you get. Don't do it. Get free help from an accredited representative.

Don't work with anyone who pressures you. Take your time to review paperwork and consider all your options, including doing nothing. Don't sign blank paperwork to be filled in later. Also, be sure your VA benefits are deposited directly into your account — and not the account of an adviser, assisted living facility, or nursing home.

Safeguard your personal information. Never share your VA login credentials or password. Check out VA's advice on setting up multifactor authentication on your VA accounts.

Get help if your VA benefits or services are affected. Call the toll-free VA Veteran Identity Theft Helpline: 1-855-578-5492.

Check your credit report regularly. You're able to get a free copy of your report every week from each of the three credit bureaus at AnnualCreditReport.com.

Finally, if you encounter identity theft, report it at **IdentityTheft.gov**. When you report, you're telling law enforcement what happened, and you get step-by-step instructions on how to recover from any type of identity theft.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY AMERICAN LEGION/ 105 Years Young

The American Legion was founded March 15-17, 1919, by members of the American Expeditionary Forces still stationed in Europe awaiting passage home from World War I. Their experiences in what was called the "war to end all wars" would shape an enduring legacy for what has become the nation's largest organization of veterans. Many of the Legion's founders had voluntarily drilled in civilian military camps before the United States entered the war. Trained in the "Preparedness Movement," several future Legion founders were commissioned

as officers in the war and discovered firsthand the nation's deficiencies in defense, citizenship, and education. Soon after the war's end, they also realized how poorly prepared the US was to assist a wave of disabled and unemployed veterans who faced uncertain futures in their communities, states and the nation. The American Legion's emergence and rise to prominence was based on a mission to strengthen the nation through programs, services and advocacy that helped millions throughout the organization's first century. The Legion built its identity with a vision to make the nation prouder, stronger, smarter, and more respectful of those who have sacrificed some, or all, in defense of the Nation.

Top Scams of 2023:

People lost \$10 billion to scams in 2023. That's \$1 billion more than 2022 and the highest ever in reported losses to the FTC – even though the number of reports (2.6 million) was about the same as last year. One in four people reported losing money to scams, with a median loss of \$500 per person. And email was the #1 contact method for scammers in 2023, especially when scammers pretended to be a business or government agency to steal money. Here are other takeaways for 2023:

- **Imposter scams.** Imposter scams remained the top fraud category, with reported losses of \$2.7 billion. These scams include people pretending to be your bank's fraud department, the government, a relative in distress, a well-known business, or a technical support expert.
- **Investment scams**. While investment-related scams were the fourth most-reported fraud category, losses in this category grew. People reported median losses of \$7.7K up from \$5K in 2022.
- **Social media scams**. Scams starting on social media accounted for the highest total losses at \$1.4 billion an increase of 250 million from 2022. But scams that started by a phone call caused the highest per-person loss (\$1,480 average loss).
- **Payment methods**. How did scammers prefer that people pay? With bank transfers and payments, which accounted for the highest losses (\$1.86 billion). Cryptocurrency is a close second (\$1.41 billion reported in losses).

Losses by age. Of people who reported their age, younger adults (20-29) reported losing money more often than older adults (70+). However, when older adults lost money, they lost the most.

A Service Officer is someone tasked with assisting veterans and their families navigate the complex world of VA benefits and ensuring that as a veteran, you and your family receive the maximum benefits you are eligible for based on your military service. Veterans choose a VSO since the services are free.

It is important that you know that you must sign and complete a "Appointment of Veterans Service Organization as Claimant's Representative (also called "power of attorney" form). This authorizes The American Legion to assist Veterans and beneficiaries. Additionally, please send your full and complete contact information. You cannot have more than one POA!

Do You Know?



Mars, Roman God of War "March" is named for the Roman god of war, Mars. This was the time of year to resume military campaigns that had been interrupted by winter. In the early Roman calendar, March (or *Martius*) was the **first** month of the calendar year. As March brought the first day of spring with the vernal equinox, it was the start of new beginnings. March became the third month when January and February, which were added to the end of the Roman calendar around 700 BCE, instead became the first and second months around 450 BCE. In ancient Rome, March marked the start of the military campaign season.

The *Ides of March* is a reference to the date Julius Caesar was stabbed to death in 44 BCE and is observed on the 15th day of the month.
