Commander's Column



KILLED IN BOMBING OF U.S. EMBASSY

On April 18, 1983, the US Embassy in Beirut, Lebanon, was partially destroyed by a suicide bombing that killed 63 people. It was the deadliest attack on a U.S. diplomatic mission up to that time and was considered the beginning of Islamist attacks on U.S. targets.



Cpl McMaugh is buried at Arlington National Cemetery. Last year a ceremony was held on MCB-Q dedicating the <u>McMaugh Hall</u> in memory of *Cpl McMaugh*. As you know our Post is named for *Cpl Robert V. McMaugh*.

You need your permanent membership ID number to start an account at mylegion.org. If you have a hand written card, you probably have a temporary number. Email me for your permanent number. Online renewals can also print out a new membership card on-line. This will show that you are paid up and I will also send out a new 2024 card once I am notified by National of your renewal.
- 2. By mail. If you've received your renewal request from National Headquarters, mail it to Post 10 at 9950 Cockrell Road, Manassas, VA 20110 attn: Post 10 Membership. If you haven't received a form from National Headquarters, send a check, and a note with your name, ID number, address, email and phone number.
- 3. In person. Stop by Post 10 and ask the bartender for a membership envelope, fill out the envelope, include your membership number and dues.

Current Legion dues for 2024 are \$35.00. REMEMBER the 2025 membership year the dues will be \$50.00. (Read notice on front page of this newsletter). Please provide your address, email and phone number. It's important to be able to contact you. 'Full Metal Modine' transports Marine Corps museum visitors to Kubrick's set By Cameron Delean, cdelean@insidenova.com

A new temporary exhibit at the National Museum of the Marine Corps in Triangle is giving museum-goers a rare opportunity to see behind the scenes of a movie set. "Full Metal Modine" is a photographic exhibition of images captured by actor *Matthew Modine* during the filming of 1987's "Full Metal Jacket." The show will be on display at the museum from March 2 through September 2025.

"Full Metal Modine" offers a glimpse into the making of a war film. A Vietnam War drama directed and produced by famed director *Stanley Kubrick*, "Full Metal Jacket" is based on Marine Corps veteran *Gustav Hasford's* 1979 novel "The Short-Timers."

The exhibition includes dozens of images captured during the filming of the movie and printed on metal. *Modine*, who played war correspondent *Private J.T "Joker" Davis* in the movie, captured the black and white images on a Rolleiflex camera given to him by a friend. While *Kubrick* seldom allowed photography onset, his response upon seeing *Modine* with the Rolleiflex was, "Listen, if you're going to take pictures on my set, this is the camera you need to get ...," according to *Modine*. "He told me about a state-of-the-art 35mm camera and which lens I should get. He even told me what kind of camera bag to purchase," *Modine* said in an interview with museum officials. "The important part of this story is that he said, 'If you're going to take pictures on my set.' That was something unheard of. And I took full advantage of that invitation." *Modine* continued, "I can look back at those days as being part of another person's life, this young kid who went on a journey to work with the legendary filmmaker, *Stanley Kubrick*." *Modine* made the images available to the museum for display, and the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation paid to have them printed on metal and framed.

The National Museum of the Marine Corps is a public-private partnership between the corps and the foundation, which preserves and exhibits the material history of the Marine Corps. Similar to the other rotating photography and artistic exhibits, "Full Metal Modine" is intended to help visitors view the Marine Corps from different perspectives. The "Full Metal Modine" exhibition opened at National Museum of the Marine Corps on March 2.

AUXILIARY UNIT 10 REPORT

The Auxiliary is excited to announce the recent delivery of our Member Support Trailer (MST)! It was custom-crafted over three months by Sons member *Randy Higgins* on a trailer frame donated by Taylor Boyz Trailer Repairs in Warrenton, VA. 100 plus hours were spent on designing, constructing,

and lettering the purpose-built trailer to meet the needs of our Post 10 family. It is a welcome addition that will be used to benefit our members during parades, recruitment drives, and other Post-related activities, such as the twoday Tank Farm event by providing food, drinks, and a central location for folks to socialize. It is equipped with a large waterproof storage area, accessible from both sides, capable of accommodating ceremonial flags and rifles along with chairs, tables, stools, and personal items. Opening a large door on the rear of the trailer reveals a "kitchen" area complete with a microwave oven, Keurig, cooler, and other kitchen items. Power for the kitchen is supplied in one of two ways – a 120-volt shoreline or a 2500-watt propane-powered generator. As if this weren't enough, there is a detachable four-foot bar that attaches to the exterior of the trailer, along with four bar stools, for members to enjoy their coffee and donuts.

The trailer was a hit as it made its official debut at the cold and rainy Manassas St. Paddy's Parade where sandwiches, coffee, and donuts were served to Post 10 members. We received numerous compliments from members and the public in general.

The Auxiliary wishes to **THANK** the Riders and Sons for their generous donations to help fund and equip the MST. Within the next few months, a user manual will be created and training will be conducted. The MST will be available for use during Post 10 sanctioned events by trained members by contacting the Auxiliary president.

It is very important that you know that you must sign and complete a "Appointment of Veterans Service Organization as Claimant's Representative (also called "power of attorney" form). This authorizes The American Legion to assist Veterans and beneficiaries. Additionally, please send your full and complete contact information. You cannot have more than one POA!

REMINDER: During ceremonies the Social Quarters is CLOSED. Post SQ Rules clearly states "During Post 10 ceremonies the Social Quarters will be closed. Occupants must either attend the Post 10 ceremony or *vacate Post 10 property*." Take the time and attend the ceremony, you may find it informative, educational, and interesting.

Did you get a call or text about a suspicious purchase on Amazon? It's a scam.

One way to spot a scam is to understand its mechanics. A new and complicated scam starts with a call or text message about a suspicious charge on your Amazon account. But it's not really Amazon. It's a scammer with an elaborate story about fraud using your identity that ends with you draining your bank or retirement accounts. Here's what to know about this scam scenario.

It's not Amazon calling. Scammers spoof their phone number to make it look like it's Amazon calling. Don't trust the number in your caller ID and don't trust what the caller tells you. Worried about a suspicious purchase on Amazon? Log in through the website or app. Don't call back the number that called you or a number someone left in a voicemail or text message.


No one legitimate will tell you to keep it a secret. If there's a problem with your account or identity, always talk about it with someone you trust — especially if the stranger on the phone says it's serious or involves a crime or claims to be from the government. That's a scam.

No one used your Social Security number to open fraudulent accounts in your name. Scammers say this to scare you — don't trust the person on the phone. To know for sure, get an instant copy of your credit report online for free and look for accounts you don't recognize. Visit (or have someone help you visit) AnnualCreditReport.com. Don't believe a caller who says you'll be immediately arrested for account fraud. That's a scam. If someone stole your identity to open fraudulent accounts, complete an FTC identity theft report at IdentityTheft.gov, then put an extended fraud alert on your credit report. Do not transfer money or drain your savings to protect it from fraud.


