3. In person. Stop by Post 10 and ask the bartender for a membership envelope, fill out the envelope, include your membership number and dues.

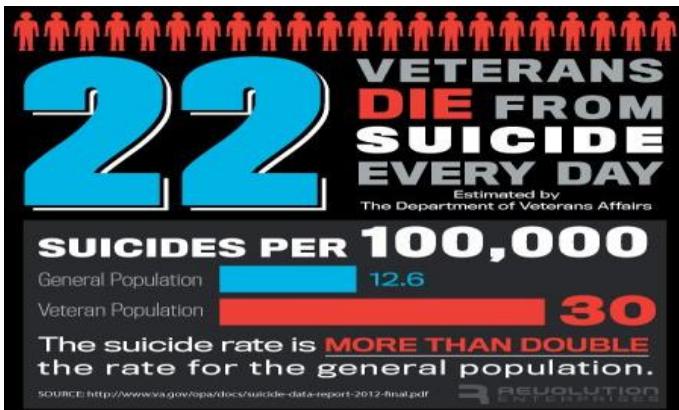

“If you see something, say something” is common theme when it comes to terrorism awareness, and that is being strongly emphasized in August. “Trust your instincts; if a behavior or activity makes you feel uncomfortable,

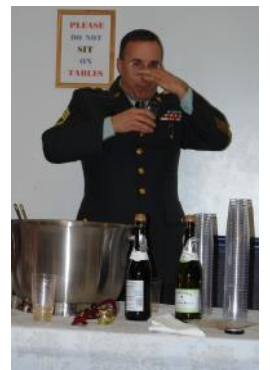

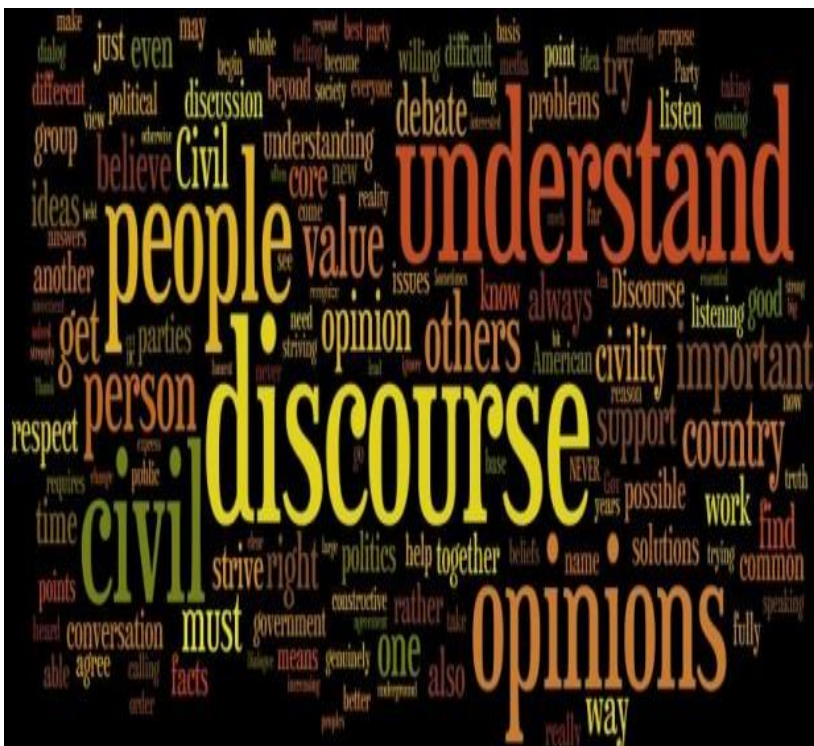

Post 10 Service Officer Column

I hope everyone is enjoying their summer! It is an honor to continue to assist veterans in filing service-connected disability claims with the VA. It is a pleasure to be able to assist you with any questions that you may have.

The Appointment of Claimant's Representative VA form authorizes The American Legion to assist Veterans and beneficiaries. Additionally, please send your full and complete contact information. You cannot have more than one POA!

I am available to assist Veterans and their families in completing and filing benefit claims. Contact **Ginger Harvey** at: ginger.c.harvey@gmail.com for VA claims assistance. Please include all of your contact information so that I can better assist you.

REMINDER: During ceremonies the Social Quarters is CLOSED. Post SQ Rules clearly states "During Post 10 ceremonies the Social Quarters will be closed. Occupants must either attend the Post 10 ceremony or *vacate Post 10 property.*" Take the time and attend the ceremony, you may find it informative, educational, and interesting.

Servicemembers: Lending a helping hand? Don't hand over your phone: Lots of scams start online, but sometimes the scammer parks right next to you at the bank or outside a store. People are reporting millions of dollars lost in a scam that targets active-duty military and plays on their desire to help. In this con, scammers approach servicemembers to ask for help because they lost their debit card and need to pay for something like a hotel room or groceries. They want you to transfer them money using your phone, but it's a scam. When you agree to help, the scammers tell you to use your phone to log into your banking app and transfer them money. They make up a reason for you to hand over your phone – maybe it's to enter their information and finish the transfer. That's when the scammer gets to work sending themselves screenshots of your account information (to use later). Or, they apply for an instant loan in your name and send the money to themselves through Zelle, another payment app, or by wire transfer. Or, the scammer uses a payment app to send themselves money through the app. And while they're busy moving money around on your phone, the scammer's sidekick distracts you with chatter about a past deployment.

When someone asks for your help, be safe: **Never hand your phone over to a stranger who asks for it** — even if it seems convenient. Bank accounts have different (and fewer) protections than credit cards, so your bank may not reverse a fraudulent transaction – no matter how large or small. **Always use two-factor authentication** (like a PIN code) for banking and payment apps, so no one else can transfer money through your mobile payment accounts.

Already sent money to a scammer? Contact your [bank](#) or a [mobile payment app](#) company immediately. Ask them to reverse the transfer and give your money back.

If a stranger approaches you like this, tell your local police right away. Then, report it to the FTC at [ReportFraud.ftc.gov](#) and to your [state attorney general](#).

Scammers impersonate airline customer service representatives

Most people can probably agree that there are few things more frustrating than airline delays or cancellations that leave you stranded at the airport. Whether the issues are the result of an unprecedented event like the CrowdStrike glitch that grounded thousands of flights worldwide, or more common disturbances like weather delays, desperate travelers often turn to social media for help from the airlines. Opportunistic scammers know this, and they're lurking behind fake accounts trying to steal travelers' information.

Scammers crawl social media looking for posts from upset travelers. They reach out to them through fake social media accounts and pretend to be an airline customer service representative who's there to help. The scammers ask passengers for a slew of information, like their booking confirmation number, phone number, or bank account. Or they send passengers to a spoofed site that harvests their personal information and use it to steal the passenger's identity or rack up charges on their accounts.

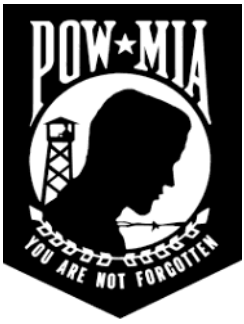
If you're dealing with travel troubles, here's how to avoid getting re-routed to an airline impersonator:

- Log in to your airline account and contact customer service through the airline's official app, website, chat, or phone number.
- If you're at the airport, speak to a customer service representative in person.
- If you reach out through social media, find the airline's official social media page on their website. Look for a verification symbol or badge. And **never give out** personal information on social media.

If someone stole your personal information, go to [IdentityTheft.gov](#) to report it and get recovery steps. And report imposters to the FTC at [ReportFraud.ftc.gov](#). Visit [FlightRights.gov](#) to learn about the airline passenger protections you are entitled to, or to file a complaint with DOT if an airline is not treating you fairly.

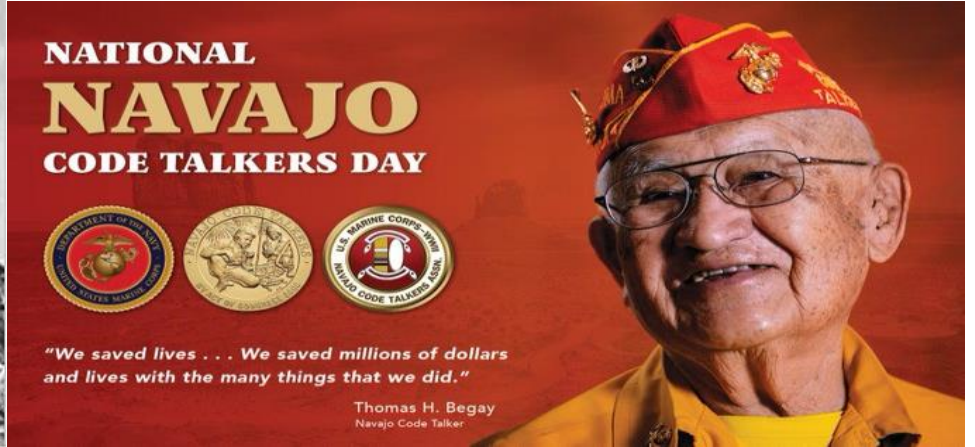
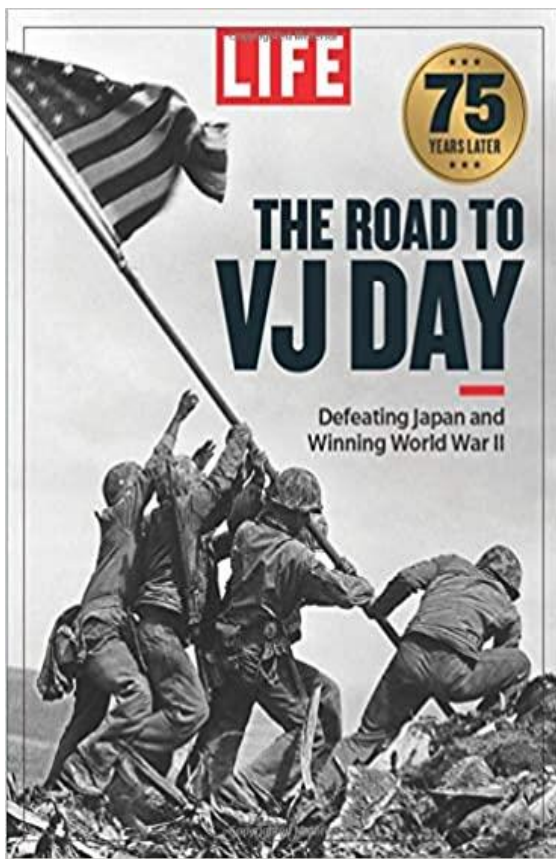

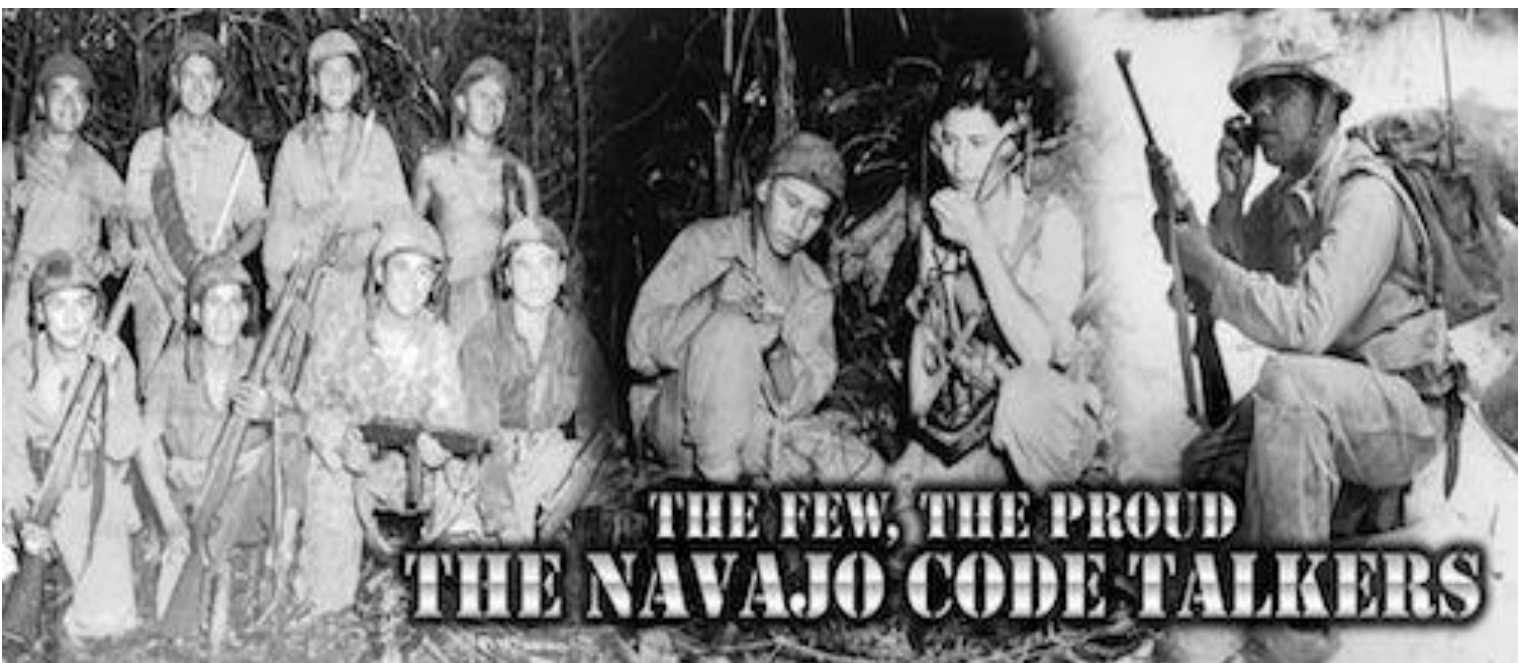

NATIONAL NAVAJO CODE TALKERS DAY

14 August 1982: President Ronald Reagan declared this day Navajo Code Talkers Day. Native American Code Talkers were inducted into the NSA Cryptologic Hall of Honor in 2013. The official plaque presentation took place in April 2014. From Navajocodetalkers.com: The story of the Navajo Code Talkers begins in 1940 when a small group of Chippewas and Oneidas became a part of the radio communications 32nd Infantry Division. Soon after, Sac and Fox tribes joined in the ranks as combat radiomen. The complexity of Navajo linguistics allowed it to become an ideal choice to be used in code due to the lack of documentation made available for learning to speak the language and ability for the same words to mean multiple things based on sound. The legacy of the Navajo Code Talkers will continue as many documentary and stories have been shared about their journey since it's declassification during Reagan's Administration.
